— The purpose of this research was to determine the effect of the use of the Internet on the learning of the English language. The study was conducted in a secondary school in the city of Lima, Peru. The sample consisted of 100 students, who were divided into two groups: one that used the Internet and another that did not. The results showed that the use of the Internet had a positive effect on the learning of the English language, as the students who used the Internet achieved higher scores than those who did not. 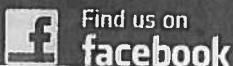

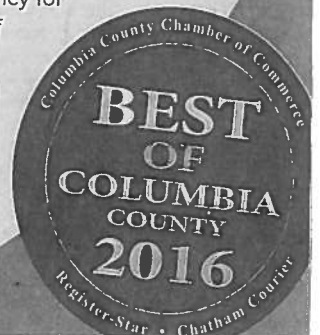
